




FOREWORD

'Bicycles, Boomerangs and Blue Macaws' is a suite of six original songs inspired by 'The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child'. Composers Sarah Murphy and Lorna McLaughlin were commissioned by Music Generation Laois, with funding from Creative Ireland Laois and The Arts Council, to facilitate a collaborative songwriting process with one hundred primary school children aged 7-12, in five classes across three schools: Cloneyhurke NS; Paddock NS, and Rath NS.

The songwriting took place between November 2022 and March 2023, with children exploring various articles from the convention alongside their rights and responsibilities as global citizens, with the children brainstorming themes they wanted to explore. The songs that you hear today emerged organically from this process, with every child contributing ideas, words, sentences, musical lines, and working with Sarah and Lorna to shape the ideas, and make decisions together.

"The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child." was agreed in 1989 and has become the most widely ratified human rights treaty in history helping transform children's lives around the world. Ireland ratified the convention in 1992 and following a referendum in 2012, amended its constitution to say "The State recognises and affirms the natural and imprescriptible rights of all children and shall, as far as practicable, by its laws protect and vindicate those rights" In subsequent years Ireland has continued to revise and embed children's rights into Irish law directly affecting children ensuring their rights as citizens.

The Convention is informed by four core principles: non-discrimination; the best interests of the child; the right to life, survival, and development; and respect for the views of the child. For the project, we explored a little about the background of the Convention, Ireland's involvement, an overview of the articles which are displayed in every primary school and then we selected 6 out of the 54 articles to sing about across all the schools.

SONG LISTINGS

Cloneyhurke 3rd-6th Class chose to think about a Boomerang of Kindness and how we all have the power to create ripples of positivity by living life in a respectful, thoughtful and kind way.

They called their song "Kindness" and introduce it with article 12

Article 12 -

Respect for the views of the child

Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously.

Rath 2nd Class chose to share their deep respect for nature and encourage us to take care of all the animals around the world. They called their song "Nature's World" and introduce it with article 29

Article 29 - Goals of education

Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment. Your education should help you use and develop your talents and abilities. It should also help you learn to live peacefully, protect the environment and respect other people.

Paddock 4th-6th Class thought a lot about what "home" meant to them, the importance of looking out for people's feelings and the emotional challenges refugees might face on being displaced by conflict or natural disasters. They called their song "Home's a feeling" and introduce it with article 22

Article 22 -Refugee children

If a child is seeking refuge or has refugee status, governments must provide them with appropriate protection and assistance to help them enjoy all the rights in the Convention. Governments must help refugee children who are separated from their parents to be reunited with them.

Rath 3rd Class focused on the importance of care of our beautiful planet and finding solutions to combat climate change. They called their song "We are the Solution" and introduce it with article 24

Article 24 -

Health and health services

Every child has the right to the best possible health. Governments must provide good quality health care, clean water, nutritious food, and a clean environment and education on health and well-being so that children can stay healthy. Richer countries must help poorer countries achieve this.

Paddock 2nd-3rd Class chose to write an empowering song that celebrates the amazing power of trees and the forest ecosystem. They called their song "You can't cut me down" and introduce it with article 23

Article 23 - Children with a disability

A child with a disability has the right to live a full and decent life with dignity and, as far as possible, independence and to play an active part in the community. Governments must do all they can to support disabled children and their families.

31 Ways to Play

Sarah and Lorna facilitated the composition of a final song across all 5 classes that explored in a humorous way what rights the children would like to add if they were asked today. This was inspired by article 31 and we called it '31 Ways to Play'.

Article 31 -Leisure, play and culture

Every child has the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural and artistic activities.

Lorna McLaughlin

Lorna McLaughlin is a musician from Co. Donegal. She was brought up surrounded by folk music, while also studying classical piano and clarinet. Lorna has a music degree from Queen's University Belfast, specialising in singing and ethnomusicology.

Lorna has had an illustrious career in both community music and in her professional performance career. She has worked in schools, elderly units, prison, hospitals, community centers, pre schools, colleges, theaters and universities in her time, most recently as a lecturer at BIMM, Dublin. She was a co-founder and musical director of the Inishowen Community Trad Choir.

Lorna is best known for her work with The Henry Girls, a group composed of Lorna and her 2 sisters, Karen and Joleen. Over the last decade, they have recorded eight albums and toured extensively in America and Europe.

Sarah Murphy

Sarah Murphy is a flautist, music facilitator, composer and Co-founder & Artistic Director of Wall2Wall Music. Her highly varied career has involved performances, music education projects and training for music services and organisations across Ireland and internationally. Sarah additionally worked as a Creative Schools Associate from 2018-21.

In 2010 Sarah established Wall2Wall Music which designs and delivers creative music workshops based on collaborative composition and performance. Sarah has led many flagship projects all over Ireland and the UK including: "At Sixes and Sevens" with Barbican Guildhall, the London Symphony Orchestra and Verbal: and "An Meitheal Mor - Global Citizens Together" commissioned under the Department of Education and Skills Per Cent for Art Scheme by Scoil San Phroinsias NS Galway, in partnership with Contemporary Music Centre, Music Generation Galway and Galway City Council, and which was featured on RTE learn.

Sarah's recent compositions include "Opening Doors" commissioned by Mid and East Antrim Borough Council and "Taiko Love" and "The Swan and The Crane" commissioned by Foyle O-Bon Japanese Festival.

MUSIC GENERATION LAOIS

Music Generation Laois provides high quality, inclusive, accessible performance music education programmes to children and young people in Laois. Music Generation Laois is part of Music Generation, Ireland's National Music Education programme, initiated by Music Network, and co-funded by U2, The Ireland Funds and the Department of Education. Locally Music Generation Laois is part of Laois and Offaly Education and Training Board and supported by Laois County Council.

Music Generation Laois operates in 32 locations across Laois each week, providing music programmes to 3500 children and young people, in settings that include schools, afterschool programmes and youth settings. Music Generation Laois also works with community organisations including Mens Sheds groups in Mountmellick, Portlaoise and Rathdowney, and most recently launched a Ukrainian Community Choir.

In 2018, Music Generation Laois and partner organisation Laois School of Music secured a dedicated creative space in Portlaoise town, Laois Music Centre. Laois Music Centre programmes a range of classes and ensembles for children, young people and adults, 6 days per week, as well as an extensive range of Summer schools, live performances, additional workshops and project opportunities. Over 750 children, young people and adults access Laois Music Centre each week.
